U.S. History and Civil Rights

This introductory 90-minute workshop offers students an opportunity to understand the history of the United States, spanning from the slave trade to the Emancipation Proclamation to the Civil Rights Movement which, many argue, continues today. Using historical facts and dates, students will construct a timeline of events which highlight the impact political decisions have had on the U.S. - the land of the free. Also available as a 120 or 180-minute workshop, the extended versions include the introductory workshop explained above alongside additional content.

The 120-minute workshop offers additional time to work on a group project, taking a closer look at specific figures who played an essential role in driving change in the minds and political outcomes that shaped America today.

The 180-minute workshop offers additional research on people of interest tailored for each group. Students will delve into specific nonviolence campaigns of the Civil Rights Movement, identifying successes and failures and the reasons behind both, giving them a much deeper understanding of effective social campaigns and tools for aiding campaigns today.
