Modern-Day Discrimination and the Black Lives Matter Movement

This introductory 90-minute workshop offers students an opportunity to understand the meaning, causes, and effects of discrimination. After a brief overview of the history behind the division of humans, students then expand their horizons globally looking at the impact this division has had on communities of color. Applying this knowledge to the BLM movement, students get a glimpse into how frustration over lack of progress led people of all races into the streets, fighting for equality.

The 120-minute workshop offers supplementary time to work on a group project, taking a closer look at specific protections offered to those who suffer under discriminatory practices and ways students can start their own campaigns or join others to improve access to equity.

The 180-minute workshop offers additional research on a topic of interest tailored for each group. Students will look closely at international conventions against discrimination and explore the impact these have had on ending this harmful practice. The workshop can include tasks which allow students to explore empathy and methods to use when faced with adversity for themselves or others around them.
